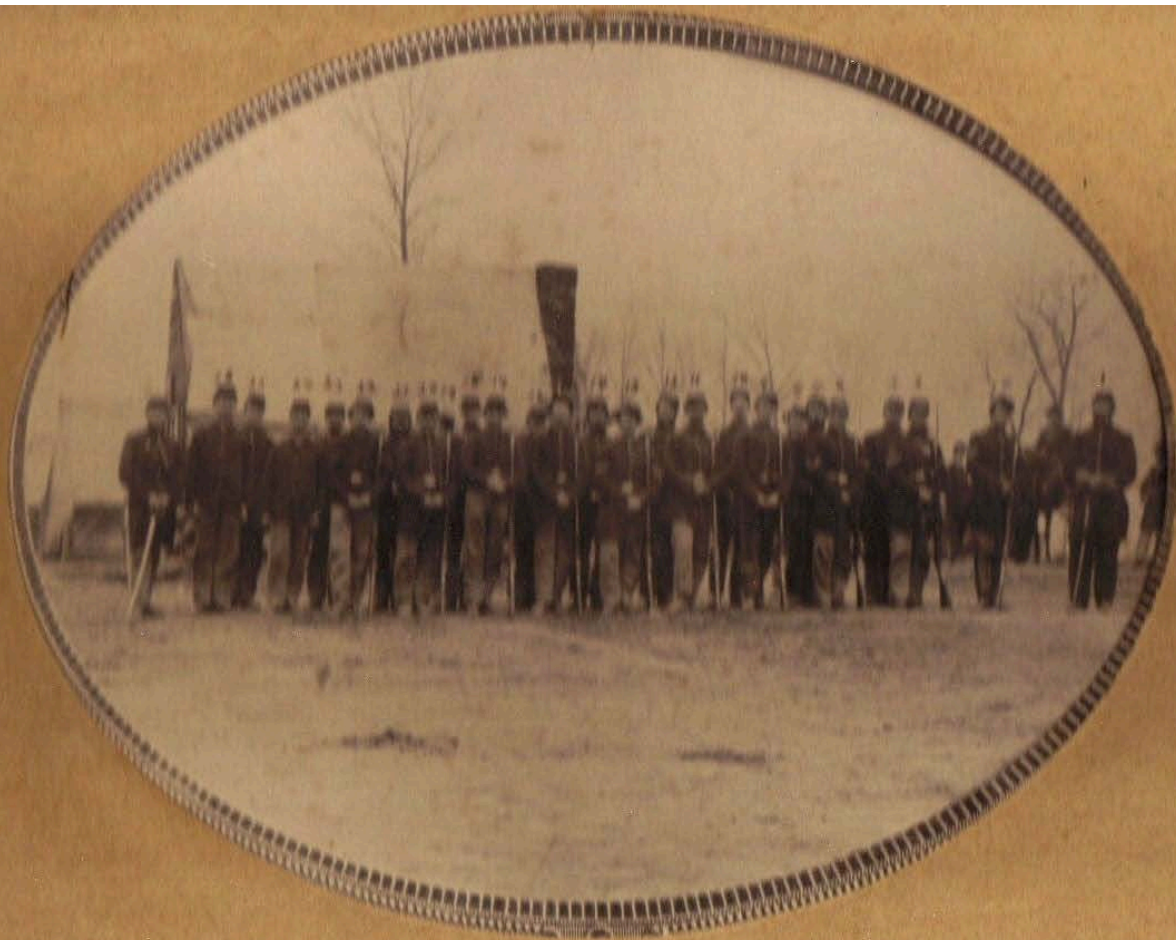

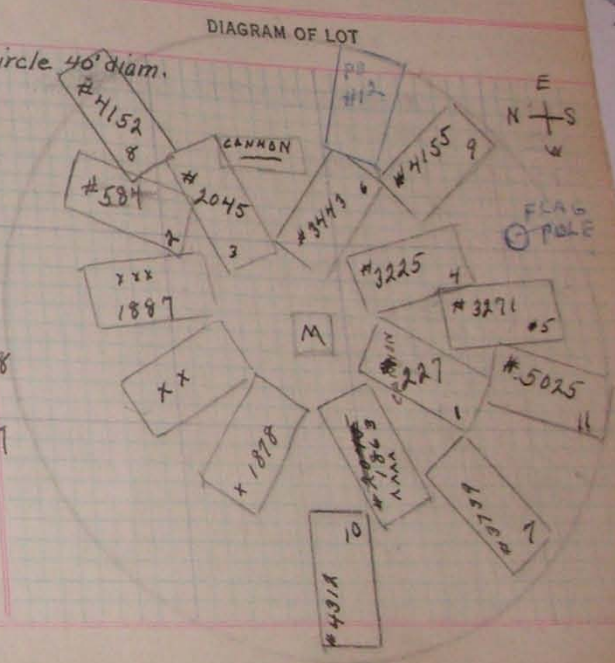

THIS COMPANY, RECRUITED AT WALDEN BY CAPTAIN DAVID CRIST,
 LIEUTENANT HENRY GOWDY AND LIEUTENANT JOHN R. HAYS,
 MUSTERED INTO THE UNITED STATES SERVICE AT GOSHEN,
 SEPTEMBER 5TH 1862, MUSTERED OUT NEAR WASHINGTON,
 JUNE 3RD 1865, WENT TO THE SEAT OF WAR EIGHTY TWO STRONG.

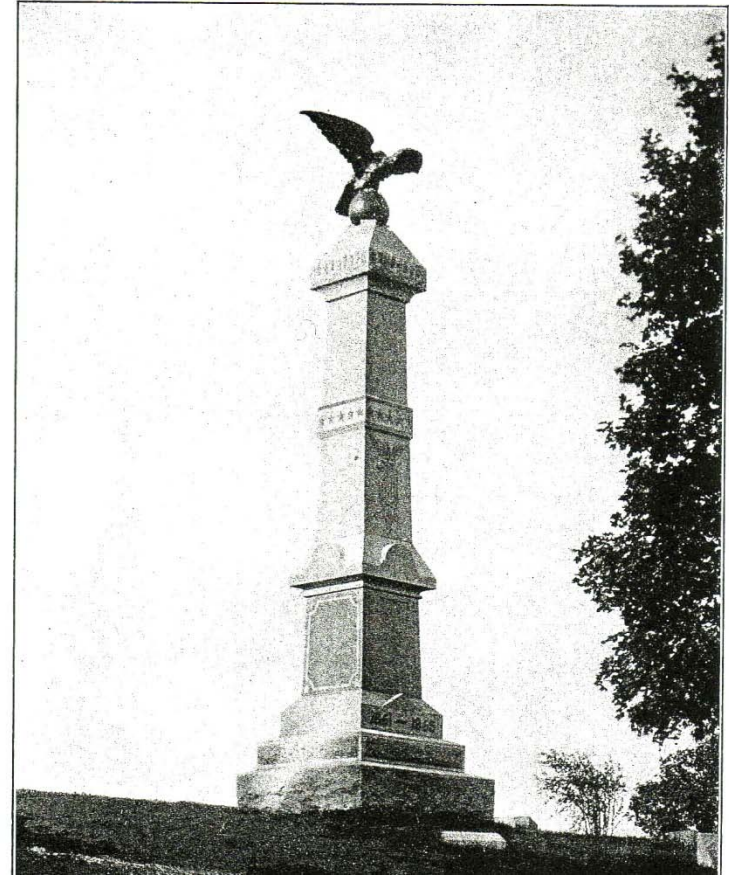

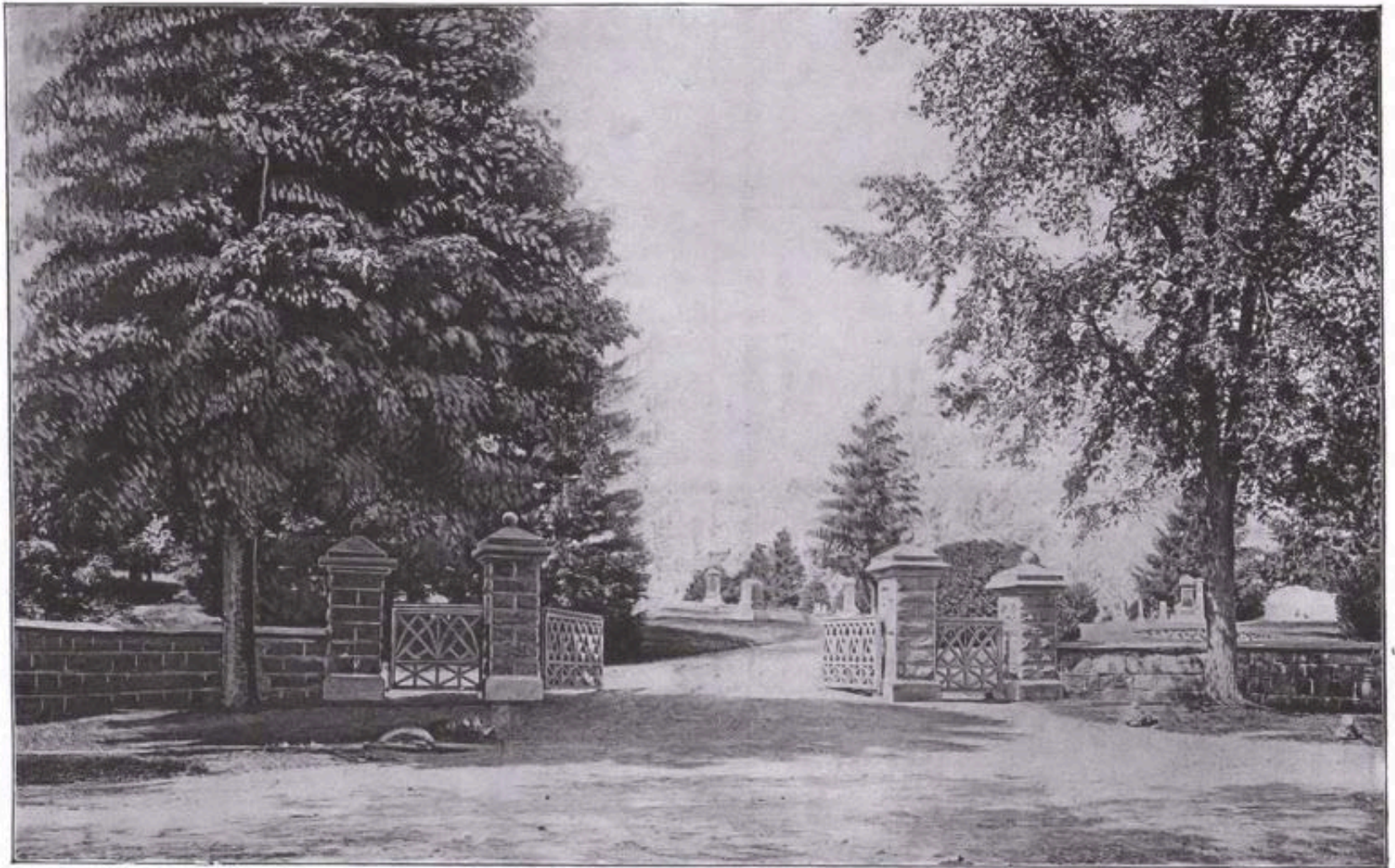


WORLD WAR I & WORLD WAR II
